The Kennedys – America's First Family



John F Kennedy is probably the most famous President in American history, but the story of the Kennedy family is not a happy one.

John was born in Boston, USA in 1917. The Kennedys were a big family, and John had five sisters and three brothers. His father, Joseph Kennedy, was a businessman, and his mother Rose was the daughter of a politician.

After university John worked as a journalist, then became a politician in 1946. But this was an unhappy time for

The Kennedys are a famous family, but their story is a very sad one.

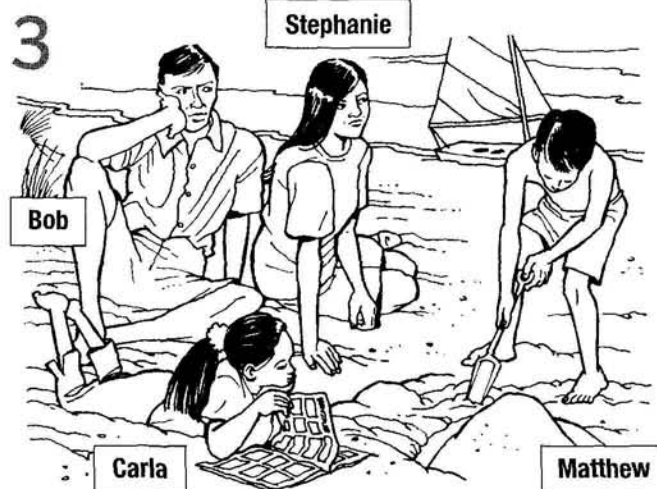

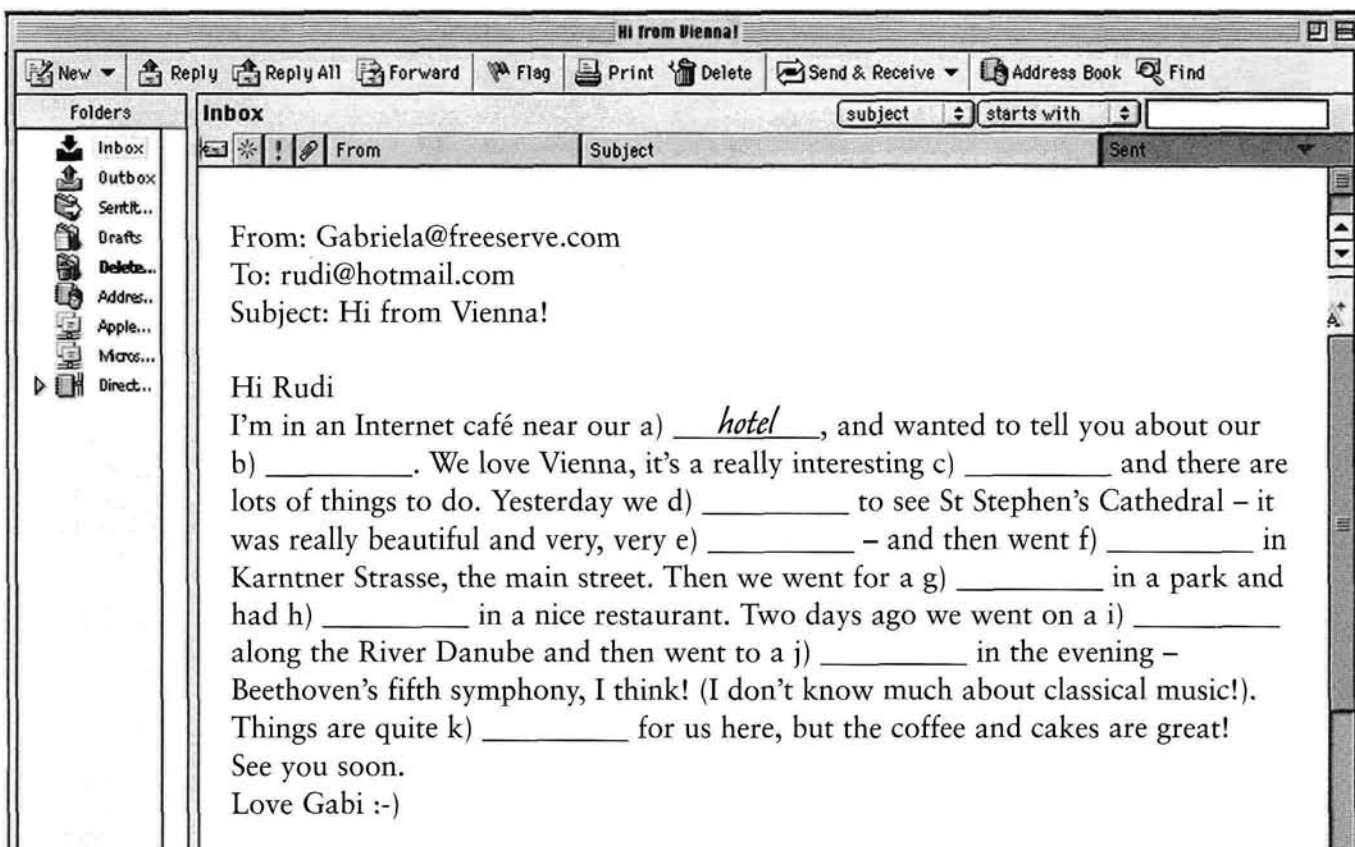

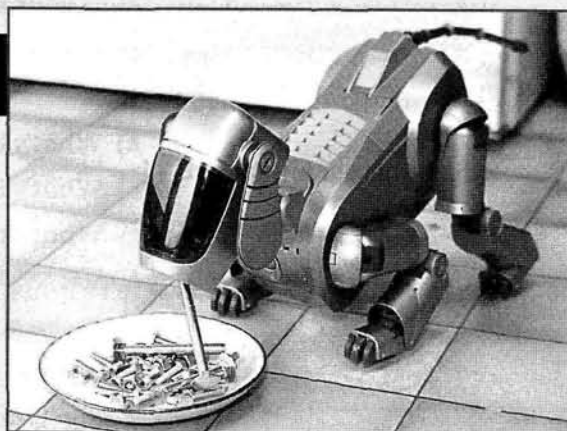

AIBO – the electronic pet

The Japanese company Sony sold the first 3,000 AIBOs on the Internet in only 20 minutes. But what exactly is an AIBO, and why do people love them so much? An AIBO is a robot dog about 28 centimetres long, and it can do lots of amazing things. For example, it can walk, run, play with a ball, be happy or sad – just like a real dog! It can also dance, sing songs, see colours and take photographs like a camera!
